EMPLOYMENT READINESS PROGRAM

ABCs of Federal Employment and Federal Resume Class: Learn how the federal hiring process works and how to prepare your federal resume for success in each stage of review.

Play Morning: A parent/child playgroup that provides socialization for parents and children ages 5 and under.

New Sibling Transition: This workshop is designed to coach families on their journey from an only-child home to multiple child home from pre-natal implementation techniques to post-partum.

Effective Coping Strategies: Participants will learn about anger as a basic emotion, how to recognize what triggers anger, the impact of uncontrolled anger on self and others and helpful tools to manage anger in healthy ways. This is a two hour workshop meant as an introduction to identifying, understanding, and coping with anger in the home, at work, and in relationships. To receive a certificate of completion, you must be present for the entire workshop.
